
Real Floor Plans uses Tablet PCs to draw your plans onsite.

Why do we do this?

Less than 5 years ago, creating the floor plans of a home could only be done in a tedious 2 stage process. Sketch the home on a pad of paper while onsite, then back at the office redraw those plans into the CAD software. This is a very time consuming process and prone to mistakes and missing parts because the technician is no longer onsite, and is unable to check their work.



Some still use the pen & paper technique today because it can lead to shorter time onsite, and it is less of an investment in the right equipment. Overall though, pen & paper takes longer to produce a floor plan, is less accurate, and more likely to miss doors, windows, and other features.

Tablet PCs are a wonder of modern technology, and allow Real Floor Plans to essentially bring the office to your site.
